

**Adoption of UNCLOS and Agenda 21** 

#### UN Convention on the Law of the Sea

### Adopted in 1982 and came into effect in 1994

- The Problems of Ocean Space are closely interrelated and need to be considered as a whole
- Twelve mile territorial waters
- The archipelagic regime
- 200 mile Exclusive Economic Zone
- Continental Shelf system
- "Area--common heritage of mankind" system
- Protection and preservation of marine environment
- Marine scientific research
- Development and transfer of marine technology
- Settlement of disputes



#### Marine Scientific Research

States and competent international organizations

- --- shall promote and facilitate the development and conduct of marine scientific research in accordance with this Convention.
- o--shall, in accordance with the principle of respect for sovereignty and jurisdiction and on the basis of mutual benefit, promote international co-operation in marine scientific research for peaceful purposes

Marine scientific research


- should receive the consent of the coastal State
- should arrange on-board participation of scientists from coastal States
- should provide coastal States with reports, data, samples, final results, and conclusions

## A Policy Framework on the Ocean Governance: Chapter 17 of Agenda 21

- the Rio Earth Summit, in 1992, adopted "Sustainable Development" principles
- Chapter 17 of Agenda 21, program of action for SD is a policy framework on Ocean Governance
- Coastal States commit themselves to integrated management and sustainable development of coastal areas and marine environments under their national jurisdiction.
- To this end it is necessary to provide for an integrated policy and decision-making process, including all involved sectors, to promote compatibility and a balance of uses.
- States commit themselves to prevent, reduce and control degradation of the marine environment so as to maintain and improve its life-support and productive capacities
- States commit themselves to improve the understanding of the marine environment and its role on global processes

### Challenges in Implementing the UNCLOS/Agenda 21 Framework

- Marine pollution over increasingly wider areas
- Conservation of Biological Diversity,
  Sustainable management of marine biological resources and proper control on IUU fishing
- Increase in transnational crimes at sea,
- Disputes over border delimitations, etc
- Harmonization between the UNCLOS/Agenda 21 regime and implementation by individual states is necessary



## Recent Japanese Initiatives on Ocean Governance and Marine-related Data and Information

- Enactment of Basic Act on Ocean Policy (2007)
- Adoption of Basic Plan on Ocean Policy (2008)
   Chapter 2: 6 Promotion of Marine Surveys
  - (1) Steady Implementation of Marine Surveys
  - (2) Collection and Compilation of Basic Information necessary for the Management of the sea
  - (3) Integration of Marine-related Information
  - (4) International Coordination
- Act on the Preservation of Low-Water Line and the Development of Basic Infrastructure of Remote Islands for the Maintaining and Promoting Utilization of the Exclusive Economic Zone and the Continental Shelf
- Marine cadastre maintenance
